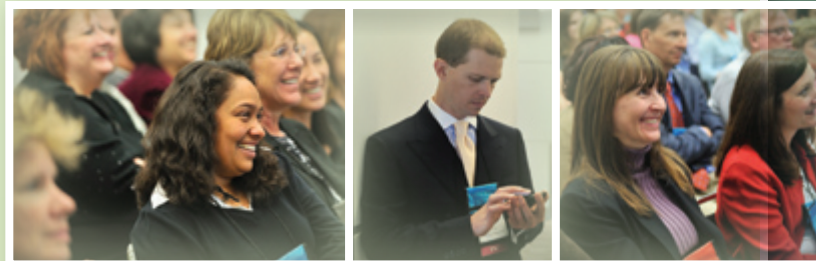
As a futurist, David Houle often is asked about predictions or forecasts he has made that proved to be accurate. His excellent record includes:
